Artwork statement

The curved timber pieces are the contours of the land as seen from a hot air balloon.

The stainless steel by Darryl Ely, is the 'channel' irrigating the three cultivated paddocks.

The circular pattern in the work is a pivot irrigator or a cyclonic weather system.
